

President's Report

G'day everyone.

So, another Club year over and a new one just beginning. Since the last Magazine, we have had the "Cruise" Run to Sturt Reserve - very pleasant - followed by Howard's Run to Tanunda which was certainly an eye opener. What a fantastic array of cars in a super impressive setting. Just stunning.



Then the "Presentation Dinner" at the Swanport Hotel. My congratulations to all those who received trophies and awards. Particular mention must be made of Graham and Maureen Edwards, who were awarded "Life Membership" and very worthy recipients they were, too. Thanks as usual to Brenda for organising the trophies.

With the AGM now behind us, perhaps a quick look at the last year is appropriate. There has been a fantastic array of Club Runs, with the pinnacle being the "Twin Bridges Rally". The organising committee of this event has received accolades from far and wide and deservedly so - it was beauty. But all of our Runs have been well supported and I believe were very enjoyable. Congratulations must go to the organisers, particularly some of our newer members. Well done all. It is difficult to get the mix of weekend and midweek runs to everyone's satisfaction and sometimes the timing of these events is forced on us by the venues/hosts/other clubs, but we can only do our best. If anyone has any thoughts on this, or any suggestions for runs, the committee would love to hear about them. If anyone could arrange a Bike Run or Commercial Run, we would love to hear from you, too.

Also, since the AGM, we have some new faces on the committee and other positions within the Club. Welcome and thank you for accepting these "jobs". Special mention must be made of Jeff Martin for his past services as Treasurer. Your performance in this important role has been fantastic, Jeff. Welcome to Ricky Kaak for taking up where Jeff left off. I am sure you will perform admirably although it may be a bit daunting at first. Thanks go to those previously filling some of the other positions who have not continued on this year. Your past assistance is appreciated.

At the recent committee meeting, the issue of meeting attendance was discussed. As you would be aware, "Provisional Members" are required to attend a Club Run and a couple of meetings (or vice versa) in their first year, before they are accepted for full membership. This is intended to ensure that new members really understand what this Club is about and do not USE us only to obtain "cheap registration". No one likes to be used. This appears to be working well, but it was suggested that these requirements should be extended to ALL members. After considerable discussion, it was decided NOT to implement this suggestion at this time. The two main reasons were that the committee felt that this was not sufficient a problem at this time to warrant this change and that to do so would snare a number of members whom we really did not think that we wanted to expel. It was agreed that, while there were a number of members who we do not see much of, it would be better to ENCOURAGE them to participate, rather than attempt to force them to do so. Members who do not attend functions do not take full advantage of their subscription dollars, as some functions are "subsidised" by the Club (Sausage sizzles, Pizza night, etc.), but we would rather see people participating, than the rest of us using up THEIR fees.

Here are a few figures we may wish to think about. At the time of writing, we have 147 members. In the past year, 40 of them have not met the criteria that we set for "Provisional Members". On the face of it, that is not good, but if we look further, there may be things to consider. From my observations, 2 of those are "Life Members", and as they have given meritorious service to the Club to gain that award, I don't think they should be kicked out. At least 3 have had significant periods of illness, another 3 have been away for extended periods and 4 have no historic car (which often discourages attendance, but they still want to remain in the club), 2 are new members with no opportunity to participate yet and 5 are believed to be leaving the Club for various reasons. That leaves 21 members of whom we haven,t seen much this year. Some may have very good reasons that I am not aware of, some perhaps do not (users). But when we look at attendances at meetings and runs (97 people at the last meeting), is 21 out of 147 members worth getting upset about? I think not. Let's show 'em what they're missing.

Finally, if you have not paid your club fees, **REMEMBER YOUR VEHICLE IS NO LONGER REGISTERED**. However, you have, of course, until the June meeting to get your paperwork sorted, but the important thing at this stage is to pay your fees.

So, that will do from me. Happy and safe restoring and historic motoring.





Mains course completed, we moved straight into the focal point of the evening – trophy presentations. There follows here a list of the individual trophies, their meaning and this year's winners:



- A body originally built by T.J. Richards & Sons.




