

President's Report

G'day everyone.

So another Christmas has come and gone. Time flies when you're having fun! I hope everyone had a good time, catching up with family and friends, as usually happens at this time of year.



Again, the cherry picking run was a great day out, even for Vicki and myself, as we were not picking this year. We had a good crop of cherries at home this year, but we were pretty worried about the forecast rain spoiling them. Crossed fingers must have worked, as they turned out fine. But it is a great spot for morning tea at Stella Creek, so we had no problems sitting back, talking and taking in the fantastic view. Lunch was great and the Mabbits added a bit of drama afterwards, when the Fairmont would not start, but of course, being a Ford, we got there in the end.

The Christmas Picnic was everything we have come to expect, although a bit cooler than some years, which was nice. Entertainment, food and company was terrific, the raffle made a small profit of about \$100 and everyone pitched in to clean up afterwards in very quick time. Very enjoyable and a big thank you to all involved.

The Pizza night has now also been, as has the Australia Day Run, so now time to look forward to the rest of the activities for the year. In particular, there is the Presentation Dinner (see elsewhere in the newsletter) and of course the AGM in April. Please have a good think about who you want to do things in your club and perhaps there is some way you can contribute yourself. Again, if you have any ideas for club runs or activities, please let us know, particularly as we need to set our run agenda immediately after the AGM.

Most of you will be aware by now that the Minister, Stephen Mullighan, has proposed significant changes to the Conditional Registration scheme that we enjoy for our historic vehicles. I have attempted to pass on as much information as I can, mainly by email and would like to thank many of you for your comments and questions. These have formed the basis of our response to the Minister, as a club, to the proposal. The Minister is very clear on what he wants the scheme to become, but at this time there is no new "code of practice", so it is unclear exactly how the new scheme will work. For that reason we have cautiously welcomed the changes. The next step is for the Minister to get the changes through Parliament, then formulate the "code of practice" which he wants to happen by 1st of July. I personally think he is a bit ambitious with his timeframe, but maybe this has already progressed further than I am aware of. I will let you all know as best I can.

It is important to remember that as far as Conditional Registration goes, AT THIS TIME, NOTHING HAS CHANGED. You will still need to get your Stat Decs signed, make sure your vehicles have been inspected WITHIN TWO YEARS, pay your membership fees and have your log books endorsed. EXACTLY AS YOU HAVE BEEN DOING FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS. Failure to follow this process will result in your vehicle being unregistered. If you have ANY doubts, please talk to one of the registrars or inspectors. There will be an opportunity to have vehicles inspected at the Cruise Night to Swanport Reserve, or on meeting nights, but NOT at any other times. Please help us to help you.

Well, that will do for now. See you at Swanport John Courtney







Run Reports

CHERRY PICKING RUN (7/12/16)



DEFIBRILLATOR for Johnstone Park Complex

Tuesday 6th of December saw the official presentation of the new Defibrillator at the Johnstone Park Combined Clubrooms (JPCC).

Some time ago, a suggestion from a member of the Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge (ACCMB) that the club purchase a Defibrillator machine. From that suggestion, the ACCMB applied to the Rural City Council of Murray Bridge for a grant through the "Community Events, Grants & Donation Program", and was very fortunate in being successful in obtaining a grant for nearly \$2,500, thus enabling the ACCMB to purchase a Defibrillator and cabinet from St John Ambulance SA. This unit has been installed in the JPCC and is now available should it be needed by any person or group using the facilities. Ongoing maintenance of the Defibrillator will be carried out by the JPCC management committee, with the support of St John SA.

Training in the use and functions of the unit was presented to all groups who use the complex, before and during the December meeting of the ACCMB, by Mr. Henry Cowell, a First Aid Advisor for St John. During Mr. Cowell's demonstration of the workings of the Defibrillator, he gave some of the facts about this machine and its purpose, as are listed;

- Approx 33,000 Australians suffer Sudden Cardiac Arrest each year.
- A person's chance of survival decreases by 10% EVERY MINUTE DEFIBRILLATION IS DELAYED. (Small window of time to save life and minimize consequence of incident.)
- Early intervention with a defibrillator can increase the chance of survival by up to 75%.
- Defibrillators are easy to use by any person, with no formal training required. Defib provides clear step by step voice prompts, including instruction for delivering CPR.
- A defib will only advise to deliver a shock if the person is in cardiac arrest and you cannot accidentally shock or hurt someone.

In closing the demonstration, Mr. Cowell advised the members of the ACCMB that St John SA is the


