



Run Reports

WELLINGTON STRAWBERRY FETE RUN (30/9/18)

The sun was shining, but a cool breeze was blowing as we gathered at Johnstone Park prior to the Run. Lots of chit-chat and general well-being was being enjoyed before the run organiser (Lyn West) called everyone together with a welcome and a rundown on the intended route. 14 cars (1 modern) and 30 people moved out and headed for Wellington. Our route took us along Flagstaff Road (which runs between Jervois Road and the Wellington/Langhorne Creek roads). 


