OBITUARY from The AUTO COLLECTORS CLUB of MURRAY BRIDGE Inc

VERNON KEVIN GRAETZ

BORN - 24th January 1939 **DIED** – 4th September 2020

Vernon Graetz was a well-known local character, truly involved in all facets of community life in Murray Bridge and districts.

Vernon for much of his working life, was a vehicle salesman for local businesses, and in his spare time was also involved the buying, selling and restoring of classic/vintage vehicles.

Vernon was involved in many charities and clubs, including Rotary, Legacy, Murray Bridge Pistol Club (Life Member), "4 Ways" dance band as a drummer/singer, including in later years, using these talents at Resthaven, singing to the residents, right up to the week before his death, a most dedicated "Santa's Helper" for 40 yrs., and of course not forgetting his beloved Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge Inc (ACCMB)

It was Vernon's dream, his enthusiasm and a love for cars, that led him to call a series of public meetings in late 1971 and early 1972, of interested people, also with a passion for cars, trucks and motor cycles, in fact anything with 4 wheels and an engine, along with the view of investigating the possibility of the formation of a car club for Murray Bridge and Districts. The investigations by Vernon regarding the formation of such a club, "rolled on towards the end", and on Wednesday 29th March 1972, the inaugural meeting was held in one of Dutton's buildings, in a room previously used by the late Mr. Eric Doecke, (former Mayor of Murray Bridge) for his butcher shop, and was attended by 12 men, 3 ladies and 4 children. A club was born, but it wasn't until a competition was held to formalize its name, that on the 9th May 1972, it was christened as "The Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge Inc.

A committee was formed, and Vernon Graetz was elected as the Inaugural President and Cofounder of the ACCMB Inc.

This new club, the pride of Vernon and his committee, boasted a founding membership of 53 members in (1972), and like the waves of the ocean, the ACCMB Inc gained momentum as it rolled along, with current membership in 2020 being 300, with as many vehicles being used, restored and unrestored.

In later years, Vernon and wife Cecily were awarded Life Membership of the ACCMB Inc and have remained members, right up to Vernon's death.

Past Presidents, Life Members and current ACCMB President Mr. Claude Minge, Management Committee and Members wish to say thank you for your foresight in 1971/72, and pay tribute to Vernon's long-standing commitment to the ACCMB Inc over the past 48 ½ years and extend their deepest sympathies to Cecily and Families.

President's Report



Our club held a belated AGM on September 1st at our Johnstone Park Clubroom. This meeting was previously scheduled for the first Tuesday in July but cancelled due to Coronavirus restrictions. These restrictions have become part of daily lives for the past six months causing many of our planned events to be cancelled. Fifteen months ago, our year as a car club commenced as a normal year with monthly meetings, club runs etc. We were successful in holding various functions and very fortunate in having a huge success with the Twin Bridges Rally in October. In March 2020 COVID 19 regulations were implemented by the government which closed our clubroom, cancelled meetings and a general public lockdown was imposed upon us. Our social activities, our interaction with not only the general public but also our families and friends changed. Those changes to our daily lives are far from being back to normal and it is not known if, or when they will return to normal. In the meantime, we have been required to adjust our lives to a new "normal". As a club we readjusted to the way we collected our subs, renewed our membership, log books, etc. and I thank all club members for adapting to these changes. The meetings at our clubroom are limited in seating capacity and under the supervision of our COVID 19 marshal. Club runs will have limitations on where we can gather for meals and bookings will be required to guarantee a venue. This may be a challenge at times but I am sure that we can adapt to making this year a success. On a positive note, we can be thankful that S.A. has been spared from the continued COVID 19 lockdown and restrictions that Victoria has experienced and continues to endure.

Another impact of COVID 19 has been the limitations on the number who can attend funeral services. As a club, our members were restricted in attending the service for Neil Kaak who died on the 5th May. His service was postponed until 7th August in the hopeful anticipation of restrictions being lifted but to no avail as those restrictions continued. Those same restrictions impacted the funeral service for our late life member, inaugural Club President and founder Vernon Graetz who died on 4th September. His service was held on September 10th at Christ Church Lutheran, Murray Bridge and the majority of club members viewed the service via live streaming. Vernon had a lifelong passion for small and large cars. The small cars were Dinky toys, Matchbox toys etc. as well as having various makes and models of drivable cars over the years. Vernon had a longstanding request that my 1924 Nash Hearse was to be used for his funeral service. Thankfully, after much tweaking of the fuel system and even more swearing the Nash performed the task of transporting Vernon from his residence to the Church without any dramas. We have diagnosed the Nash has recovered from coronavirus symptoms previously experienced at Neil Kaak's service! Some of Vernon and Cecily's vehicles also followed in the cortege, namely, the 1936 Cadillac LaSalle, 1981 Bentley, 1975 Mercedes Benz 450SE (now owned by Bob and Gloria Neindorf) and VW Combi van. Although his health issues had been challenging over the past months, COVID 19 restrictions placed even more pressure on him to remain isolated. Let us remember Vernon for his long and active involvement with the ACCMB since the formation of the club in 1972.

As we face the year ahead, I ask that we all stay positive about our club's future. Be positive with planning club runs and events as there are ways and means of how they can be organized. Let us formulate some ideas and have some discussion regarding possible club runs for this year so that we can "enjoy our cars and socialize with likeminded people"



Run Reports

DRIVE YOUR OLD CAR DAY 1/9/2020.

September 1st is recognised as the first day of Spring so it is an ideal time to bring your historic vehicle out of winter hibernation. This year it was also an ideal time to bring it, along with the owners, out of Covid-19 hibernation, as we had not had a "proper" run since March. So once again we accepted the invitation from the Gawler Veteran, Vintage and Classic Vehicle Club to attend their "Drive it day" at the Bethany Reserve.

10 vehicles and an enthusiastic group of members departed our clubrooms, along with another three vehicles that joined in along the way or met us there. We took a little bit different route this year, out the Mannum Road, then turning up the Milendella Road past Apamurra, to eventually meet up with the Angas Valley Road and over the hills to Mount Pleasant. It's a really nice little drive. The "pit stop" at Mount Pleasant also provided an opportunity to visit the bakery to sample their wares. It was a bit busy though, as a number of other vehicle enthusiasts were also present, some obviously also heading to Bethany, but a number of others simply out to enjoy the sunny spring weather.

After leaving Mount Pleasant, we again presented the opportunity to lose a few of our participants and were not disappointed. Just before Bethany, Paul Wade was seen scratching his head, muttering "I was tail end Charlie, but now I have all these cars behind me. How did that happen?" Fortunately, we all arrived at Bethany despite the navigational mishaps, to be cheerfully greeted by the Gawler Club blokes, who relieved us of the Covid-19 tracing forms and directed us to suitable parking spots.

As in previous years, a wonderful array of interesting vehicles awaited our inspection. I believe a record 220 historic vehicles were present at this 14th. running of this event, but it is the variety of those vehicles that surprises us each year. Vehicles ranging from a 2CV Citroen, Model T Fords, Ford and Bedford trucks, through to a pair of very impressive Mk.
