McLaren VALE VINTAGE & CLASSIC

On Sunday April 3, 2022, the McLaren Vale Vintage & Classic will return, bringing the region alive once again with a grand parade of motoring history, vintage fashion, local wines, gourmet food and live entertainment. **Vehicle registrations are now open,** and entries can be completed by filling out the online form or printed entry form. The entry fee is \$30 per vehicle. In its 16th year, the event will see more than 500 vintage and classic motor vehicles parade along the streets of McLaren Vale against a breathtaking backdrop of wineries and vineyards.

All vehicles will begin their journey on the open lawns located at the front of Serafino, where entrants will indulge in a delicious breakfast to fuel them for the day ahead, mingle with fellow car lovers and see the range of period outfits from participants. The Grand Parade will officially commence at 11am with all vehicles rolling out of Serafino for the 2km drive along Main Road where hundreds of spectators will line the streets to enjoy the motorcade. All spectators are then encouraged to head down to the participating wineries where a range of vehicles will be displayed and enjoy a day of food, wine, and music.

Please note that if drivers are submitting an online form, they must remember to make payment for their entry fee to the event's account via Internet Banking or through a cheque. Entry cannot be processed until this payment is received. An email will then be sent with a receipt of entry and payment. We would love if you could please help support this local fundraising event and spread the word registrations are now open. Vintage, classic and motorcycle vehicles are all welcome. for the past few years. #88 was locally constructed and developed in the 1960's by Ian Thiel, Roy and a team of mechanics and helpers at Fischer Ford and has always "lived" in Murray Bridge. 

NEUTROG FACTORY KANMANTOO (7/10/2021)

Making "Fertilizer While the Sun Shines" was the Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge (ACCMB) theme for their latest run while COVID restrictions have been somewhat relaxed in South Australia.

October 7th in warm spring weather, 23 ACCMB members in their 13 classic / modern vehicles, as usual assembled at their clubhouse for the usual sign in, and the distribution of details to participants by Neutrog run coordinators – Graham & Maureen Edwards. Last minute changes, back to the original route was brought about by a couple of apologies and a no-show member, but that's life in today's COVID world.

The convoy departed the clubhouse right on 9am, heading along Thomas St, Cypress Tce., left onto Rocky Gully Rd, before continuing onto Monarto Rd, before the group took a short stop off to view the new Monarto Safari Park (MSP) visitors entrance and the new Visitors buildings and parking currently under construction. CALLINGTON SHOW (31/10/2021)




