President's Report

WHERE WERE YOU IN 1972?

The year was 1972. Some of our younger ACCMB members will have no memory of 1972 simply because they had not been born. But for the rest of us think back to 50 years ago when we had a very different lifestyle.

We had T.V.s, radios, and cassette tape players but mobile phones, big screen TVs and computers did not exist.

We had Valiant Chargers, Holden Kingswoods, Monaros, and Toranas, Ford Falcons, Cortinas and Escorts.

In Murray Bridge the Princes Highway which is the highway between Adelaide and Melbourne ran through Bridge St and over the old bridge built in 1879. The Swanport Bridge and the Freeway Bypass did not exist. There were 16 petrol stations along that road within Murray Bridge- 5 on Eastside, the rest along Adelaide Road out to Ampol (now Mobil).

At our riverfront, Sturt Reserve was where we all dumped our rubbish for 20 years – that included green waste, household rubbish, building materials, fridges, TVs etc.

The farming area of Monarto had been purchased by the State Government (Don Dunstan) to redevelop as a satellite city to Adelaide.

On March 29th1972 the ACCMB was founded by a group of local vehicle enthusiasts headed by Vernon Graetz. From humble beginnings the ACCMB has grown to what we have today. After 50 years we are very fortunate in that we have a good number of inaugural members, many of whom joined us on the 50thanniversary celebration of the ACCMB held on the 26thand 27thMarch. Along with past and present members we all enjoyed a great weekend of reminiscing, and renewing friendships and acquaintances. We were fortunate in having good weather, good food and the excellent organisation of the activities for the weekend. The 50thcelebrations didn't just happen. There was planning by our 50thcommittee over many months, along with COVID 19 rules thrown into the equation to test the planned event.

On behalf of the ACCMB I thank the members of the committee for their dedication, skills and commitment given in making this special event a reality and one that we all enjoyed. The committee and their partners are John & Vicki Courtney, Graham & Maureen Edwards, Roy & Elaine Bretag, Terry & June Mabbitt, Jan Hall, Darren Fountain, Marlene & Alan Hagger, Yvonne & Peter Mach. To all of you, a job well done.

CRUISE NIGHT 11/2/2022




