The subject of club fees and subs was discussed at length during our ACCMB Committee Meeting on 08/11/22.



The subs/year have been \$35:00 for 16 years, since 2006. The \$35:00 includes spouse/partner, which equates to \$17:50/person. (Full details in Committee Report in magazine).

Our new subs will be \$50:00/member.

Our discussions at Committee centred on the fact that Club operational costs continue to risesuch as insurance, printing and postage, maintenance of club property etc. We focussed on the fact that to have a vehicle on club conditional registration for one year is approximately \$80:00. This compares to full registration for one year being approximately \$700:00 for a six-cylinder vehicle.

Being a car club member is still a very cost-effective way of keeping our cars registered and on the road.

In regard to further improvements in our clubrooms, a big thank you to Peter Hoare who has donated two bookshelves to our revamped library and storeroom.

In case you were unaware, Christmas is only a few weeks away and of course 2023. Please remember our Christmas celebration is on 11th December, so bring your Christmas cheer!!

There is no meeting in January, but we have our annual pizza night at John and Vicki Courtney's home on 13th January. (Please advise attendance to John).

From the Editor

Welcome to the latest edition of "Auto Torque".

We humans have houses of great many designs and colours, some small and sparse, others spacious and luxurious. Our own piece of personal paradise. Have you been in the doghouse? Ever ventured into the hen house to collect the eggs. I am positive we have all visited the outhouse for sure. The word 'garage' comes from the French verb 'garer' – 'to shelter' and entered the English language right at the start of the 20th Century. But not everybody approved. The architect Charles

Harrison Townsend, writing in 1908, noted that the French term 'garage' was being used for the new car storage buildings that were popping up everywhere. He disapproved and suggested "...the more desirable English equivalent of 'Motor House'."

As you can imagine, the name 'Motor House' didn't catch on and the nation has been happily parking their cars in garages for over 100 years. The first residential garages in the homes of the wealthy tended to be converted outbuildings. As the habit of driving spread to the upper middle classes, a desire for cheap garages led to the emergence of a thriving business in Norwich.

The Norwich manufacturing company, Boulton and Paul, are perhaps best remembered for their contribution to the war effort building planes. However, before they became the country's number

one producer of Sopwith Camels during the First World War, they made their money supplying prefabricated garages. The prefabs were cheap and could be erected in hours – and the technology developed to house cars was used in the 1940s to house thousands of families made homeless by the war and slum clearances.

The first garage doors were side-hinged double barn doors that opened outwards. The up-and-over door was the first innovation — a 'float over door' and is advertised in an American catalogue as early as 1902. Sectional doors and roller doors and innovations such as spring-loading to assist opening all came along soon after. A properly maintained door should last a long time (we've all seen some ancient ones!)



These days, garages are common on larger premises and a great feature if you wish to sell your house. The earliest garages tended to be owned by motor enthusiasts – some of whom would have an inspection pit in the floor of their garage and pullies installed in the ceiling for lifting out heavy engine components. Now, residential garages are more for storage than tinkering.

So, what is your garage space used for. Our vintage and collectable vehicles, of course. Safe and Happy driving to all.



Run Reports

WELLINGTON STRAWBERRY FETE 2/10/2022

The first morning of Daylight Saving saw a small band of Club Members gathering at the Johnstone Park grounds at the beginning of what would be a perfectly beautiful day. 7 cars left the Clubrooms at just after 9:00 a.m. and one more caught up with the group along the way. We took a course along Maurice and Hindmarsh roads to the Jervois/Wellington Road and turned off at Flagstaff Road. The only time I use this road is when we do a Run to the Wellington Fete and it is such a pleasant drive through undulating country, lush with crops at the moment.

Local Wellington identity, Des Kluske (who turns 90 years of age this month – October), was waiting to admit us and the incoming Fete Organiser (Bob Radford), had an area reserved for our Club's static display. Jeff Martin, ably assisted by Peter Mach and Harry Howitt (I hope I haven't left anyone out!) erected the Club Flags, which set off our display nicely. I must thank Jeff for reminding me about the flags. I had forgotten about them so it's obviously too long since I have organised a Club Run! We were joined by a couple more Club Members in modern cars later.





Then we all settled down to do as we liked – having morning tea, perusing the fete stalls, chatting – all the while intermittently shifting our chairs to take advantage of the much-appreciated shade from a large gum tree.

There were lots of stalls – bric-a-brac, handicrafts, fresh produce, a travel agent, food stalls, a BBQ and, of course, strawberries/ice-cream/cream. Tom and I couldn't believe the size of the serve we received. I think I had a full punnet of strawberries in mine! And they were delicious.

During the morning, I met up with the outgoing Fete Organiser (Jude Male) and she said to watch out for her later and give her a wave as she came down to earth in a tandem skydiving jump. I have known Jude a long time, so I had to see that! We became aware of some activity in a field at the rear of the Fete venue. There were a few men in fluoro jackets trying to re-locate some cows. And the cows were not happy! They obviously didn't want to leave their field and ran away from the men, mooing loudly. I couldn't help the vision coming into my mind of a skydiver landing on a cow and going for an unexpected ride! It's the stuff comics are made of. But eventually, the men redirected the cows somewhere else, and all settled down.

We had seen the little plane flying aloft and gathering height before it began to lighten its load. One, two, three persons made single jumps, landing expertly. I wondered if Jude had had cold feet, but no! The final dive was Jude, strapped to her companion, and they also made a text-book landing (at

least, it looked like that to me). She received a rousing cheer and clap from the many onlookers. It certainly was something different for the Wellington Strawberry Fete.

The rest of the day was spent in a very pleasant, relaxing manner. Because we were a smaller group, we sat in one circle, which allowed interaction and conversation on a level not usually achieved when there are more present. We all packed up when the Fete came to an end, about 2:00 p.m., and made our individual ways home. It was obvious to me that everyone enjoyed their day and I thank them for attending and for their support in the fundraising for the maintenance of the Wellington Hall.
