#### **REGISTRATION OF VEHICLE TYPES**

As you would be aware, the members of the Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge were recently given the opportunity to have their say on the types of vehicles that could access Conditional Registration through THIS club. The SA Government recently amended the Code of Practice – Conditional Registration Scheme to allow for the inclusion of "Individually Constructed Vehicles" and as we as a club had not previously specified what could be registered at all, the Management Committee decided that it was high time we did, so that existing and future members would know exactly where we stand. As a result, a ballot was held, and the results were as follows: -

- Registration of Historic Vehicles 100% in favour
- Registration of Left-Hand Drive Vehicles 92% in favour
- Registration of Street Rod Vehicles 71% in favour
- Registration of Individually Constructed Vehicles 64% in favour.

As a result of this ballot, the Management Committee agreed to update the section of our "Club and Rally Rules" on *Conditional Registration* to reflect these views, but also take the opportunity to correct some other minor errors that had occurred over time, such as the DPTI now being called the DIT. Therefore, that section will now read as follows.

#### **CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION**

There are two main DIT documents that persons who have vehicles on "Conditional Registration", or intend to have, must be familiar with.

- Code of Practice Conditional Registration Scheme for Historic. Left-Hand Drive, Street Rod, and Individually Constructed Vehicles (Latest Version).
- MR1457 Modifications to Passenger Cars, Utilities, Panel Vans and 4WD Passenger Vehicles (Latest Version)

Copies of these documents may be accessed from our Club Website.

Members with Historic Vehicles, Left-Hand Drive Vehicles, Street Rod Vehicles, and Individually Constructed Vehicles may access conditional registration through *The Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge Inc.* providing the vehicles are roadworthy, comply with the Code of Practice, MR1457 and any other relevant criteria.

In addition, the following rules apply to members availing themselves of "Conditional Registration" Through **THIS** club: -

The vehicle must be inspected by a Club Registrar before an MR334, or Logbook will be issued.

- Any modifications must be legal. This may be determined by, but not limited to, MR1457.
- Those applying for "Conditional Registration" must be aware that the Club Registrar is
   obliged to report to the DIT, any questionable modifications that do not have a
   "Certificate of Exemption" issued for them. This MAY require inspection at Regency
   Park.
- The Club Registrars from time to time, may request the inspection of any vehicle.
- A "Review Committee" has been formed within the club, to clarify any issue should a
  dispute arise from this process.



# <u>AUTO COLLECTORS CONROD CHALLENGE ACCEPTED! 12 – 14<sup>th</sup></u> April 2024

For over 45 years, motor vehicle enthusiasts and collectors from Murray Bridge, the Riverland, Bordertown, and Mallee regions have taken part in the "CONROD CHALLENGE WEEKEND".


Initiated in 1978, club members, families and friends from the Bordertown Vehicle Restorers Club, the Riverland Car Club, the Murray Mallee Auto Club, and the Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge have come together annually, for a weekend of fun and friendship-albeit with a somewhat competitive undertone.

Up for grabs, was the coveted Conrod Trophy-a rod from a 40hp single cylinder tractor, mounted on a polished wooden board and which bears the names of all previous successful club winners.

Proudly kept by the winning club for the following year, the Conrod trophy symbolises the strength, resilience, and fundamental necessity of such a piece of equipment in a vehicle. One could use this analogy to represent these automotive enthusiasts. Just like the conrod-which converts energy, guides connecting parts and is responsible for the proper operation of an engine-so too are the committees and members of these car clubs, whose common interest in motor vehicles has brought them together for decades.

And so, it was once again, that early on the morning of Saturday April 13<sup>th</sup>, that 25 vehicles ranging from a 1928 Oakland, a '62 Zephyr, a '69 Jaguar, right through to more modern vehicles-a Statesman, a BMW Roadster, a MazdaBT50-assembled at the ACCMB Clubroom.

But when the Denning Coach pulled up, driven by Riverland Club member, Richard MacLean, everyone was especially impressed. The Denning brand is Australia's oldest bus manufacturing company, with all products fully designed, engineered, and assembled in Australia.





The first stop was to "Aussie Apricots", where we were treated to an informative talk given by Kathy and Paul Prosser and their daughter Jade. Kathy has owned and operated the chocolate-making side of the business for 18 years and visitors were kept both amused and satisfied by the light-hearted banter between the trio and of course, delicious chocolate-covered fruits and other delights. A quiz sheet was given out to all clubs' members, with points to be tallied and accumulated during the weekend. (Points were awarded on day 1 of the weekend, for correct

answers which went towards the determining of a winner for the Conrod trophy, after the next competition on Sunday).

Following on from Aussie Apricots, we proceeded to the nearby "Revolution Motor Museum", also owned by the Prosser family, where members and visitors were privileged to

view over 30 vehicles and motor bikes, as well as innumerable pieces of automobile memorabilia.

Quiz sheets were again frantically being filled out....
Our hosts provided a delicious barbeque lunch and conversations revolved around the enormous task that Paul and Kathy have undertaken, but all acknowledged its impressiveness and tourism potential in a regional area.



Saturday night dinner was spent at Swanny's Hotel and

Bistro, where fun, laughter and fellowship were continued to be enjoyed by all.

The weekend's activities recommenced bright and early on Sunday morning, (day 2) where a Putt Putt Golf challenge at the Avoca Dell Holiday Park had been arranged. Suffice to say, there were no Tiger Woods or Greg Normans among the 50 competitors, but some good

scores were achieved, with

several "holes-in-one" being recorded.

Accumulated scores from each of the three participating clubs were again tallied and recorded......

A casual luncheon, including a celebratory "2024 CONROD CAKE" for dessert, culminated an enjoyable weekend of activities, fun and laughter, with just a hint of competitive camaraderie!

After intense scrutinising of the quiz sheets and golf scores, the Auto Collectors Club of Murray Bridge narrowly defeated the Bordertown Club to reclaim the Conrod Trophy, with the Riverland Club coming in at a creditable third place. The ACCMB will be the

custodians of the trophy until next year, when the Mallee Auto Club will host the Conrod Challenge weekend-then let the games begin.......
